Knowledge		The origin of collage Italian portrait painters had pasted small pieces of chain, gilded paper, and sometimes real stones and jewels onto their canvases. Tessellation means an arrangement of shapes closely fitted together, especially of polygons in a repeated pattern without gaps or overlapping.	Monet was committed to plein-air painting: starting and finishing a painting outside in front of the subject.	<b>Textile History.</b> The term ‘Textile’ is a Latin word originated from the word ‘texere’ which means ‘to weave’.		<b>Banksy</b> is a <b>famous</b> - but anonymous - British graffiti artist. He keeps his identity a secret. He produces pieces of work which pop up in public places, such as on the walls of buildings. A lot of his art is done in a particular style which people can easily recognise.
