Dear Parents/Carers,

I hope you are all well and keeping safe. As you're likely aware, the government has announced that schools should fully reopen from the start of the upcoming autumn term. This means we are planning to open to all of our pupils in September. We are looking forward to welcoming everyone back on **Tuesday 1st September**, and we are working hard to make the school a safe, enjoyable environment. Children attending Nursery and Reception will begin on Monday 7th of September as they will be invited to meet with their class teachers prior to starting either the new academic year or their Herrick Journey – letters to be sent out closer to start date.

I have no doubt that you have numerous questions and concerns in-relation to children returning to school. Therefore each Friday before commencement of the autumn term there will be a weekly update on our school website with relevant information that will help support your understanding of the measures the school will put into place.

We are going to commit time during September to ensuring that routines, expectations, standards, relationships and values are quickly re-established. At Herrick we will be focusing on 3 key priorities – Safety, Pastoral Care and Curriculum (each priority is then linked to 3 specific types of support). See diagram below:
